


- 1. He worked MANY miracles in His ministry.
  - a. He healed all manner of sickness (Matthew 9:35).
  - b. He multiplied food (Mark 6, 8).
  - c. He walked on water (Matthew 14:25ff).
  - d. He raised the dead (Mark 5; Luke 7; John 11).
  - e. He cast out the workers of Satan (Matthew 8:16).

When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick...

2. The miracles were not done in secret.

"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a Man attested by God to you by miracles, wonders, and signs which God did through Him in your midst, as you yourselves also know..."

# Jesus worked miracles.

2. The miracles were not done in secret.

#### **Examples:**

- a. Turning water into wine (John 2:1-11)
- b. Healing a paralyzed man (Mark 2:1-12)
- c. Feeding the five thousand (Mark 6:33-44)

3. Even the enemies acknowledged them.

"Then one was brought to Him who was demonpossessed, blind and mute; and He healed him, so that the blind and mute man both spoke and saw. And all the multitudes were amazed and said, "Could this be the Son of David?" Now when the Pharisees heard it they said, "This fellow does not cast out demons except by Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons."

4. The miracles confirmed His identity.

This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

# The apostles and other disciples worked miracles.

1. The apostles received "special revelation" from the Holy Spirit (John 14:25-26; 16:12-15).

how that by revelation He made known to me the mystery (as I have briefly written already, by which, when you read, you may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ), which in other ages was not made known to the sons of men, as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to His holy apostles and prophets:

  - a. Mark 16:15-20; Hebrews 2:1-4
  - b. Pentecost (Acts 2:1-12)
  - c. Corinth (1 Corinthians 2:4)
  - d. Samaria (Acts 8:6)

#### **Lessons to take home:**

- 1. The miracles had a specific purpose.
- 2. We have God's complete will in the Bible.
  - a. "all truth" John 16:13
  - b. "once and for all delivered" Jude 3
  - c. "granted us everything pertaining to life and godliness..." 2 Peter 1:3
  - d. "so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."
